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## **RECONSIDERATIONS**

### **R-01                    Interamerican Services Corporation Case No. 2014-20351**

Nicole Jordan with Prosecution Services presented this case involving the alleged violation of Section by violating section 456.072(1)(k) FS (2014), by violating a rule of the Board of Pharmacy, through a violation of Rule 64B16-28.202(3), FAC, by failing to notify the Board of Pharmacy in writing as to the effective date of closure and return the pharmacy permit to the Board of Pharmacy office or arrange with the local Bureau of Investigative Services of the Department to have the pharmacy permit returned to the Board of Pharmacy, and notify the Board of Pharmacy which permittee is to receive the prescription files.

This case was previously brought before the panel as an Administrative Complaint on July 22, 2015 and has been brought back as a reconsideration for dismissal. Based on the current status of Respondent's license, further prosecution of this case is not warranted. Should the Respondent reapply for licensure, the allegations addressed in this case shall be addressed before a new license will be issued by the Board of Pharmacy.

After discussion, a motion was made, seconded and carried unanimously to DISMISS this case.

**Action taken:** Pursuant to Section 456.073(2), Florida Statutes, this case is hereby DISMISSED.

### **R-02                    Stephen Gregory Logsdon, R.Ph. Case No. 2012-12522**

Nicole Jordan with Prosecution Services presented this case involving the alleged violation of Section by violating section 456.072(1)(hh), FS (2012), by being terminated from a treatment program for impaired practitioners for failure to comply, without good cause, with the terms of the monitoring or treatment contract.

This case was previously brought before the panel as an Administrative Complaint on March 8, 2013 and has been brought back as a reconsideration for dismissal. On or about March 14, 2015 the Respondent passed away.

After discussion, a motion was made, seconded and carried unanimously to DISMISS this case.

**Action taken:** Pursuant to Section 456.073(4), Florida Statutes, this case is hereby DISMISSED.

**R-03**

**Masterpharm, LLC  
Case No. 2015-24231**

Amy Thorn with Prosecution Services presented this case involving the alleged violation of Section by violating section 456.072(1)(f), FS (2009,2010,2013,2014,2015), which provides that having a license or the authority to practice any regulated profession revoked, suspended, or otherwise acted against , including the denial of licensure, by the licensing authority of any jurisdiction, including its agencies or subdivisions, for a violation that would constitute a violation under Florida law is grounds for disciplinary action.

This case was previously brought before the panel as an Administrative Complaint on October 28, 2015 and has been brought back as a reconsideration for dismissal. Because the conduct that led to the out of state discipline occurred before that conduct was a violation under the statutes and rules of Florida, it is not subject to discipline by the state of Florida.

After discussion, a motion was made, seconded and carried unanimously to DISMISS this case.

**Action taken:** Pursuant to Section 456.073(4), Florida Statutes, this case is hereby DISMISSED.

Matt Witters with Prosecution Services presented this case involving the alleged violation of Section 465.016(1)(t)1 and/or 3; Count two – violation of section 465.016(1)(s), FS (2014); Count three - violation of section 465.016(1)(r), FS (2014), by and through a violation of Rule 64B16-27.810(1)(b), FAC.

This case was previously brought before the panel as an Administrative Complaint on July 22, 2015 and has been brought back as an Amended Administrative complaint.

After discussion, a motion was made, seconded and carried that probable cause has been found.
